Rock 'n' Rollercoaster at OpenPark!

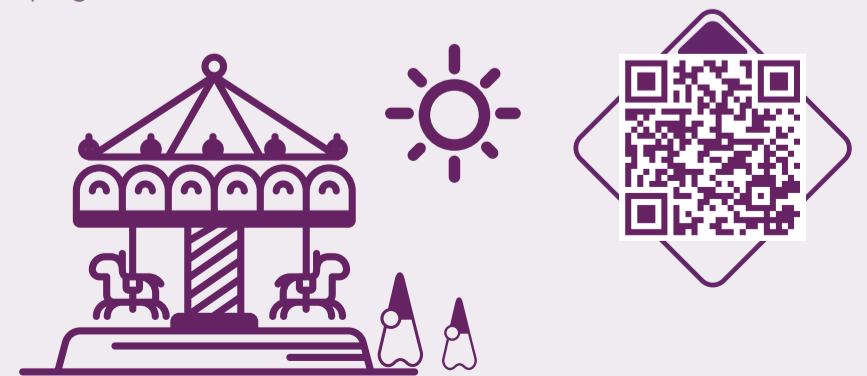
